

# **Safe Food, Fair Food Annual Planning Meeting from 6th to 8th May, 2013**

# Regional

- We organized from 05 to 09 November 2012 a write shop at Bassam, Côte d'Ivoire with regional coordinators of SFFF 2 to finalize the project outputs from the previous phase of the Safe Food, Fair Food project for the wider dissemination and as part of the second phase's component on enabling environments.
- Prof Bonfoh participated on the launching of the West African network of participatory epidemiology in Togo on 15 November 2012.
- We organized on 21 November 2012 a mini symposium at CSRS on "Strategies to reduce foodborne illnesses through an integrated approach involving humans, the environment and food. " The purpose of this mini symposium was to gather in roundtable physicians, veterinarians, pharmacists, biologists, social anthropologists and economists involved in the management and care of foodborne illnesses for the development of a common project.

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- Following the mini-symposium that we organized at CSRS from 05 to 09 November 2012, on "Strategies to reduce foodborne illnesses through an integrated approach involving humans, the environment and food. We invited in West Africa to develop a project on mitigating food poisoning an agent syndrome in human through intervention design at the human-environment-food value chain interface in Africa (patients and environment management based on risk analysis, clinical features and socio-economic). Submitted to Afrique One

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- Prof Bonfoh went to Bamako to sign a convention between CSRS and Central Veterinary Laboratory (CLV) of Bamako.
- Prof Bonfoh gave a course on epidemiologic survey at Ecole Inter-Etats des Sciences et Médecines Vétérinaires de Dakar (EISMV) and another course on operationally epidemiology at Institut Supérieur des Sciences et Médecines Vétérinaires de Dalaba (Guinea).
- CSRS participated at festival of Attiéké at Blokosso, Abidjan to promote this local meal which is product by women and sold on informal markets from 18 to 27 January 2013.

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- Prof Bonfoh was assisted by Sylvain and Mireille at University of Nangui Abrogoua in a course on assessment of the quality of milk, fish, meat, crustacean and mollusk.
- A cooperation between CSRS and Rakuno Gakuen University, Ecole Inter-Etats des Sciences et Medecines Veterinaires de Dakar (EISMV), LCV of Bamako and Institut Superieur des Sciences et Medecines Veterinaires de Dalaba (Guinea) was established now.



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- Participation at Burkina Faso to WAHO/ WAHRNET conference, West african organisation of health
- Conference which will take place at Dakar in june for the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of RASPA
- The conference Africa 2013, will be held in Côte d'Ivoire from 1 to 5 october 2013 and CSRS was associated to organization of this conference which will be an opportunity to promote our tool participatory risk analysis.

# Projets

- CSRS got a project entitled Standardization of traditional starter of Cassava «Mangnan». The principal investigator of this project is Mr. Yobouet Bassa Antoine. The budget of the project for three years is 49 941 100 FCFA.
- CSRS got a project entitled Food allergy from biological to social: Analysis of socio–sanitary functions of prohibited food in Côte d'Ivoire for three years. The principal investigator of this project is Mr. Valentin Bognan. The budget of the project for three years is 7000 000 FCFA.
- Sylvain submitted to PASRES a project on exposure of consumers of grilled thon and smoked maquereau related to histamine, *Staphylococcus* and salt with collaboration of prof Bonfoh, Dr Makita, Mr Yobouet Bassa, Prof Koussémon marina from University of Nangui Abrogoua and Dr Fabienne Jagger from Swiss TPH.
